'I am the good shepherd.

and the wolf snatches them and scatters them.

The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep.


There are many pathways that people can follow in response to God's invitation and call to service. How are you called to serve?

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# SYNOD ON SYNODALITY CONTINUING TO EXPLORE THE SYNTHESIS REPORT LOOKING AT CHAPTER 9WOMEN IN THE LIFE AND MISSION OF THE CHURCH

Let's continue walking together by taking a look at the XVI Synod Assembly. Today we are going through the "Convergences" part of chapter 9-- Women in the Life and Mission of the Church" Recognizing the unity and complementarity of men and women, the Synodal Assembly responds to Pope Francis's exhortation to be a people of the Beatitudes. Baptized into the same dignity, women and men are called to co-responsibility as co-protagonists in the life and mission of the Church.

### PART II - ALL DISCIPLES, ALL MISSIONARIES

## 9. Women in the Life and Mission of the Church



We are created, male and female, in the image and likeness of God. From the beginning, creation manifests unity and difference, bestowing on women and men a shared nature, calling, and destiny, and two distinct experiences of being human. Sacred Scripture testifies to the complementarity and reciprocity of women and men, and to the covenant between them that lies at the heart of God's design for creation.



## Baptismal Dignity

In Christ, women and men are clothed with the same baptismal dignity (Gal 3:28) and receive equally the variety of gifts of the Spirit. We are called together into a communion of loving, noncompetitive relationships in Christ, and to a co-responsibility to be expressed at every level of the Church's life.



Jesus considered women his interlocutors: he spoke with them about the Kingdom of God; he welcomed them as disciples, as for example Mary of Bethany. These women, who experienced His power of healing, liberation and recognition, travelled with Him on the road from Galilee to Jerusalem (Lk 8,1-3).



Women desire to share their spiritual experience of journeying towards holiness in the various stages of life: as young women, as mothers, their friendships and relationships, in family life all ages, in working life, and in consecrated life. Women cry out for justice in societies still marke by sexual violence, economic inequality and the tendency to treat them as objects. Pastol accompaniment and vigorous advocacy of women should go hand in hand.



Where **dignity** and **justice** are undermining in relationships between men and women the Church, we **weaken the credibility** our proclamation to the world. Our **synoc path** shows the need for **relational renew** and **structural changes**. In this way we calletter welcome the **participation** are contribution of all as **co-responsit disciples** in the work of **mission**.

### What is discernment?

Discernment is a process by which we are helped to reach a decision in the light of faith and in the context of our personal reality and the realities of the world in which we live. Discernment involves trying to identify what is of God, what is for our full happiness and for others and distinguishing or separating that from what is not of God or from what is simply driven by my ego, societal expectations, family or peer pressure.

### Some Helpful Hints

- Keep in mind that discernment isn't easy and it takes time be patient with yourself and God!
- You may find it helpful to keep a journal so that you can record your thoughts and reflections.
- Come to your process of discernment with an open heart be prepared to be surprised by God!
- Remember that choosing one way means letting go of another way no matter how good is.
- It's always hard to choose between two or more "goods".

### **Some Discernment Steps**

- 1. Place yourself in the presence of our loving God. Make some quiet time and special space for prayer and try not to fill the time with lots of words in your prayer. Listen to your heart and to God in the movements of the Holy Spirit in you. Reflect on your vocation. You may find it helpful to pray in the quietness of your room, in Church in front of the Blessed Sacrament or in the quietness of nature. Ask God to speak to your heart.
- 2. **Find a spiritual director or wise and trusted soul-friend** someone you can be really open and honest with who can help you deepen your relationship with God and know yourself better.
- 3. Pray for freedom to understand and choose what is in harmony with God's designs for you.
- 4. You may find it helpful to take a piece of paper and write down what you think are alternatives for you and then look at the appeal and the advantages or disadvantages of each one for you and for others. Consider your reasons for choosing a particular way. Which reasons best lead to your loving service of God and others? In relation to each alternative ask yourself again how you best need to be loved and how you can best love.
- 5. Realistically consider your gifts and limitations, your deep desires and needs and how they might fit well with possible life choices.
- 6. Listen to words of confirmation or affirmation from others in your process.
- 7. Where are you feeling peace? What most draws you close to God?
- 8. Gently and with patience come to a decision and in prayer and action search out further confirmation of your choice. Offer the fullness of your choice and life to God.
